Subject: Call One Telephone Services

Over the past three years the Village has had contracts for telephone services with CallOne Communications. Theses contract included three types of copper communication lines. Line type and status descriptions are below.

PRI Lines:

Each PRI line provides 24 telephone call connections. So if 24 calls are placed at one time from Village desk phones one PRI circuit can connect all of the calls. The Village currently has three PRI circuits. A PRI circuit requires a contract with the vendor for a minimum of one year.

The three Village PRI circuit were recently moved to a new vendor. AccessOne was able to provide the same services at a lower cost. CallOne no longer provides our PRI services.

T1 Data lines:

Each T1 line provides a data connection. The Village had two T1 lines one at each Fire Station. These lines provided connection from the Fire Station to the Village Hall network. The T1 lines provided desk phone service, email, application access, and file access to our Fire Stations. A T1 circuit requires a contract with the vendor for a minimum of one year.

The two T1 lines were canceled. The above listed Fire Station services are now provided across wireless bridges that were installed. CallOne no longer provides the Village with T1 services.

Low Baud/POT Lines:

Low Baud and POTS lines are very similar to a land line a resident would have at their home. The Village has this type of line in many locations. Examples of the locations are Village fax machines, credit card machines, elevator emergency phone, Fire Station overhead alarm systems, Fire Station direct ring downs to DuComm and the ECC, security alarms, and fire alarms.

Low Baud and POTS lines copper pairs are all owned by AT&T. CallOne provides billing and support help if there are issues with the lines. The provider does not require a contract on this line type, as they are just

passing along the costs. Over the past five years AT&T has significantly increased the charges for Low Baud and POTS lines. AT&T is attempting to price these line types out of existence.

Staff will be exploring alternative options in the upcoming years to the low baud and POTS lines, as they have become prohibitively expensive. As alternatives are implemented, we will drop the applicable lines, which is a reason we do not want to execute a contract with CallOne, and lock in any services. However, we are seeking authorization to continue services for the low baud and POTS lines with CallOne until the time that an alternative is implemented.

Therefore, staff is requesting Village Board approval for CallOne to provide Low Baud and POTS lines on a month-to-month basis, in an amount not to exceed \$11,000 monthly.
