Proposal

The Village is considering professional engineering services to conduct inspections of private improvements to ensure that all public and private aspects of the work comply with all applicable requirements. These tasks will be performed under the direction of the Community Development Director, William Heniff, and Private Development Engineer, Jana Bryant. Thomas Engineering Group, LLC (TEG) anticipates that services will be on-call inspections on a part-time to full-time basis.

SCOPE OF SERVICES

The purpose of this job is to conduct construction site inspections of all privately initiated improvements, to ensure that all public and private improvements comply with applicable requirements. The work is performed under the direction of the Community Development Director.

Generally, TEG will provide inspection for all roadway, pavement, driveways, water main, sanitary sewer, force main, and storm sewer installation in accordance with the essential functions of a Development Services Inspector. TEG's scope of services for specific work items is outlined below:

- Conducts site inspections of privately initiated improvement projects; prepares daily inspection reports regarding conditions found, action taken, work performed and recommendations; prepares lists of deficiencies for project closeouts.
- Ensures public and private improvement compliance with standard construction procedures, approved review plans and municipal codes and ordinances.
- Coordinates proposed and ongoing site construction with supervisors, contractors, other departments and government agencies.
- Surveys sites for drainage issues and brings them to the attention of the Village.
- · Performs other functions as assigned or required.

TEG is committed to providing excellent service that brings the highest value to the Village and its residents. This commitment is shown through our previous work and through our passion for our profession of going the extra mile for our clients.

OTHER KEY TASKS

Engineering Plan Reviews – TEG Understands the Village's need to be able to quickly and accurately evaluate site, access and development plans. Upon notice to proceed, TEG will meet with the Community Development Director to thoroughly discuss the current means and methods of the Village. CONSTRUCTION INSPECTION TEAM

The people identified for this project are qualified personnel and who are committed to providing long-term value for the Village of Lombard. The following are brief descriptions of the personnel committed to this project and their roles on the team.

TEG will provide a single point of contact, **Kent Williams**, our proposed Lead Inspector, who will be responsive to any Village or Developer inquiry within 24 hours. Mr. Williams is a Senior Technician, who has over 12 years of experience involving bridge, municipal, and highway/roadway construction management. Over these 12 years he has compiled a wide range of construction knowledge and experience while working for IDOT, ISTHA, CDOT, various counties, and municipalities. Kent's professional experiences range from bridge construction and rehabilitation, bridge painting, bituminous and concrete paving, earth excavation, drainage, water main, structural construction, lighting and signalization. Kent recently served as the resident engineer for an 11 block residential street and utility reconstruction project in Elgin and a \$785K water main rehabilitation project in the City of Wheaton.

Kent will be assisted by other qualified Thomas Engineering Group support Inspectors, as necessary, at the Village's direction. TEG additional support staff will be under the direct supervision of Mr. Williams. He will schedule and communicate each inspection task, within 24 hours from the time of notification, to the appropriate and Village-preferred construction inspector. TEG understands the importance of being responsive during fast moving construction activities and we are committed to responding promptly. TEG wants to be an active part of the development process and therefore will strive to not be the reason that construction doesn't start on time. We will work with the developer and the developer's engineer to keep projects from being delayed.

Mr. Korolis has knowledge and experiences pertaining to earth excavation, drainage structures, water main installation, landscaping, and bituminous road resurfacing. Mr. Korolis also assists staff on design projects.

Mr. Syed has over 12 years of extensive international experience in construction engineering and construction inspection and documentation of various types of projects including roadways, industrial and drainage inspection. He possesses proficiency in quality control procedures; specifically in the field of site inspection. Measurement and recording executed works, preparing reports, maintaining site records and interpersonal skills to effectively interact with coworkers, clients and contractors.

Stephen VanDeveer

Mr. VanDeveer is an ISA certified arborist with phase I and phase III experience in the arboriculture field. He has over 10 years of experience involving vegetation management, tree surveys, roadway, bridge, and utility construction. He has specialized experience and training in root protection and tree health maintenance during construction. As a construction inspector, he also has experience with utility construction and maintenance, HMA and WMA pavement, PCC pavement, pavement patching, PCC and



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latex concrete bridge deck construction, steel and concrete bridge beam repairs, bridge substructure construction and repairs, precast pedestrian tunnel installation, concrete box culvert installation and repairs, earth excavation, trench backfill, furnished excavation, PCC sidewalk, stamped / dyed concrete sidewalk, curb and gutter, guardrail, striping, and traffic control and protection.


Tomasz Tretowicz

Mr. Tretowicz performed a wide scope of tasks associated with street resurfacing projects, sidewalk replacement program, and water and sewer main improvements. He has taken on many responsibilities during his time in Oak Park, incorporating roles of a technician, drafter, resident engineer, design engineer, and an inspector. Some of his duties included site surveying, CAD drafting, plan design, construction oversight and inspection as well as utilities coordination, residential coordination and overall project management. In addition to capital improvement projects, Mr. Tretowicz acted as a liaison with private utility companies. He has administered permitting and conducted right-of-way restoration inspections.

FEE

Hourly billing rates listed herein are based upon qualified employees that are available to meet the Village's assignments. We propose to accomplish the work on a Time and Material basis using the hourly billing rate for our qualified construction personnel and a Direct Labor Multiplier (DLM) method of compensation. The DLM method of payment compensates the Consultant for actual direct costs plus a specified multiplier. The allowable IDOT direct labor multiplier is 2.80 times the cost of direct labor, however, we are proposing a fixed 2.60 multiplier for 2018, resulting in the below listed billing rates.

GENERAL CONTRACT TERMS AND CONDITIONS

SUSPENSION OF SERVICES

The VILLAGE may, at any time, by written order to Thomas Engineering Group, LLC ("TEG") require TEG to stop all, or any part, of the services required by this Agreement. Upon receipt of such an order TEG shall immediately comply with its terms and take all steps to minimize the occurrence of costs allocable to the services covered by the order. The VILLAGE will pay for costs associated with suspension provided they are deemed reasonable by the VILLAGE.

TERMINATION OF AGREEMENT

The VILLAGE reserves the right to terminate the whole or any part of this Agreement, upon ten (10) calendar days written notice to TEG. The VILLAGE further reserves the right to cancel the whole or any part of the Agreement if TEG fails to perform any of the provisions in the Agreement or fails to make delivery within the time stated. TEG will not be liable to perform if situations arise by reason of strikes, acts of God or the public enemy, acts of the VILLAGE, fires or floods.

Upon such termination, TEG shall cause to be delivered to the VILLAGE all surveys, reports, permits, agreements, calculations, drawings, specifications, partially and completed estimates and data, as well as products of computer aided drafting, design and writing that have been paid for by the VILLAGE. Costs of termination incurred by TEG before the termination date will be reimbursed by the VILLAGE only, if prior to the effective termination date, the VILLAGE receives from TEG a list of actions necessary to accomplish termination and the VILLAGE agrees in writing that those actions be taken.

RELATIONSHIP BETWEEN TEG AND VILLAGE

TEG and its authorized representatives (collectively "TEG") are retained by the VILLAGE only for the purposes and to the extent set forth in this Agreement, and TEG's relationship to the VILLAGE shall, during the term of this Agreement and period of its services hereunder, be that of an independent contractor. TEG shall be free to dispose of such portion of its entire time, energy and skill during regular business hours when they are not obligated to devote time and services hereunder to the VILLAGE, in such manner as TEG sees fit and to such persons, firms or corporations as TEG deems advisable. It is acknowledged that at all times the TEG is separate and independent from the VILLAGE and that TEG will utilize a high level of skill necessary to perform the services under this Agreement.

Not Employees. TEG and its authorized representatives (collectively "TEG") shall not be considered as having an employee status, nor shall the VILLAGE withhold any sums for the payment of income taxes or FICA taxes, nor shall TEG be entitled to participate in any plans, arrangements or distributions by the VILLAGE pertaining to or in connection with any pension or retirement plans, or any other benefits for the regular full-time or part-time employees of the VILLAGE. As an independent contractor, it is the responsibility of the TEG to file all necessary

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tax returns (federal, state, county and local) and to pay all income tax, social security, and any and all other taxes due as an independent contractor in its profession. As an independent contractor, the TEG agrees that it is ineligible to file a claim for unemployment compensation benefits or for workers compensation benefits against the VILLAGE and agrees not to file such claims in the event this Agreement is terminated. TEG agrees to assume all risk of death, illness and injury relative to performing all services under this Agreement. TEG understands and agrees that, as an independent contractor, it is not an employee of the VILLAGE for any purposes of any kind and all state, federal and county laws or regulations that apply to or provide benefits or protections to employees do not apply to it, including, but not limited to, the application of the Fair Labors Standards Act minimum wage and overtime payments, Federal Insurance Contribution Act, the Social Security Act, the Federal Unemployment Tax Act and the Worker's Compensation Act (820 ILCS 305/1, et seq.).

INVOICING AND PAYMENT

This Agreement is for the delivery of the services outlined in the Agreement. TEG shall submit invoices in duplicate not more than once each month, such statements shall be inclusive of a detailed breakdown of all charges incurred. The invoice shall detail personnel name, title, rate of pay, hours charged and task worked. All direct costs shall be itemized consistent with the various categories itemized in the proposal. Invoices shall be based on actual hours of performance. The VILLAGE agrees to make payments and to pay interest on unpaid balances under the provisions of the Local Government Prompt Payment Act.

CHANGES

The VILLAGE reserves the right by written amendment to make changes in the requirements, amounts of work and work schedule to be performed under the Agreement. TEG and the VILLAGE shall negotiate appropriate adjustments acceptable to both parties to accommodate any changes.

INSURANCE

- (A) During the term of the Agreement, TEG shall provide the following types of insurance in not less than the specified amounts:
 - 1. Comprehensive General Liability \$1,000,000.00 per occurrence;
 - 2. Auto Liability Combined Single Limit Amount of \$1,000,000.00 on any TEG owned, and/or hired, and/or non-owned motor vehicles engaged in operations within the scope of this Agreement;
 - 3. Workers Compensation Statutory; Employers Liability \$1,000,000.00 (the policy shall include a 'waiver of subrogation');
 - 4. Umbrella Coverage \$3,000,000.00 (this shall apply to General Liability, Auto Liability and Professional Liability, except if the amount for Professional Liability

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exceeds these combined limits, then Umbrella Coverage does not need to apply to Professional Liability); and

- 5. Professional Liability \$2,000,000.00.
- (B) TEG shall furnish to the VILLAGE satisfactory proof of coverage of the above insurance requirements, by a reliable company or companies, before commencing any work. Such proof shall consist of certificates executed by the respective insurance companies and filed with the VILLAGE. Said certificates shall contain a clause to the effect that, for the duration of the Agreement, the insurance policy shall be canceled, expire or changed so as to the amount of coverage only after written notification 30 days in advance to the VILLAGE. In addition, said certificates shall list the VILLAGE and its officers, agents and employees as additional insureds on all required insurance policies except the policy for professional liability.
- (C) TEG shall require sub-consultants, if any, not protected under TEG'S policies, to take out and maintain insurance of the same nature in amounts, and under the same terms, as required of TEG.

INDEMNIFICATION

TEG shall indemnify, defend and save harmless the Village of Lombard, its officers, agents, employees, representatives and assigns, from lawsuits, actions, costs (including attorneys' fees), claims or liabilities of any character brought because of any injuries or damages received or sustained by any person, persons, or property on account of negligent act or omission or any willful misconduct of said TEG, its officers, agents and/or employees arising out of, or in performance of any of the provisions of the Agreement, including, without limitation, any claims or amounts recovered for any infringements of patent, trademark or copyright; or from any claims or amounts arising or recovered under the "Worker's Compensation Act" or any other law, ordinance, order or decree. In connection with any such claims, lawsuits, actions or liabilities, the Village of Lombard, its officers, agents, employees, representatives and their assigns shall have the right to defense counsel of their choice. TEG shall be solely liable for all costs of such defense and for all expenses, fees, judgments, settlements and all other costs arising out of such claims, lawsuits, actions or liabilities.

COMPLIANCE WITH LAWS

TEG shall, at all times, observe and comply with all laws, ordinances and regulations of the Federal, State, local and VILLAGE governments, which may in any manner affect the preparation of proposals or the performance of the Agreement.

COMPLIANCE WITH OSHA STANDARDS

TEG shall comply with all applicable requirements and standards as specified by the Occupational Safety and Health Act for duration of the Agreement.

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NON-DISCRIMINATION

- a. TEG shall, as a party to a public contract:
 - 1. Refrain from unlawful discrimination in employment and undertake affirmative action to assure equality of employment opportunity and eliminate the effects of past discrimination;
 - 2. By submission of this Proposal, the CONSULTANT certifies that it is an "equal opportunity employer" as defined by Section 2000(e) of Chapter 21, Title 42, U.S. Code Annotated and Executive Orders #11246 and #11375 (42 U.S.C., Section 2000 (e)); Exec. Order No. 11246, 30 F.R. 12319 (1965); Exec. Order No. 11375, 32 F.R. 14303 (1967) which are incorporated herein by reference. The Equal Opportunity Clause, Section 6.1 of the Rules and Regulations of the Department of Human Rights of the State of Illinois, is a material part of any contract awarded on the basis of this Proposal.
- b. It is unlawful to discriminate on the basis of race, color, sex, national origin, ancestry, age, marital status, physical or mental handicap or unfavorable discharge for military service. CONSULTANT shall comply with standards set forth in Title VII of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, 42 U.S.C. S2000 et seq. and The Human Rights Act of the State of Illinois (775 ILCS 5/1 101).

FORCE MAJEURE

The VILLAGE shall not be liable for any fault or delay caused by any contingency beyond their control including but not limited to acts of God, wars, strikes, walkouts, fires, natural calamities, or demands or requirements of other governmental agencies.

VENUE

The parties hereto agree that for purposes of any lawsuit(s) between them concerning the Agreement, its enforcement, or the subject matter thereof, venue shall be in DuPage County, Illinois, and the laws of the State of Illinois shall govern the cause of action.
