IMPACT

1) Please describe how the event or program will promote overnight stays and/or tourism within the Village of Lombard.

This event will be marketed to a wide audience that will encourage overnight stays. As this has not been executed before, the exact impact is not known.

2) Please describe the economic benefit to local businesses and the Lombard community. How will your event draw more people from outside the local market (50 miles or more) or attract a new visitor audience?

Visitors often are looking for activities to do in the surrounding area. Twelve percent of visitors want to visit a museum and 9% want to visit a historic site. Combining that with a destination that offers shopping and dining which 31% and 27% want to participate in prospectively, this combines wanted activities. This event will be marketed to a wide audience that will encourage overnight stays. As this has not been executed before, the exact impact is not known. However, we will be working with as many local vendors as possible including Tim Frakes Productions, Laura Ellingsen Designer and Prairie Glen Productions. We are also working with the DCVB to create motor coach visits from tour groups and encourage them to eat, sleep and shop locally.

3) Who is the target audience for your event or project? What is your anticipated attendance?

The art community, history enthusiasts, the Art Institute patrons, folk art lovers, families and group travelers. We will be offering art activities during the day for children and expert docents in the evening to bring repeat visitors.

We also worked with Tim Frakes Productions and he generously donated his services to produce a documentery that we have free unlimited use as well as duplication services. Orders and press are already underway.

This is the marketing piece. It will be advertised as a local tour via facebook and on our website and be included in future marketing with the DCVB. The Press has already begun and is being picked up by local and regional markets. Plans to also advertise in national magazines are underway.

Two to three Sheldon Peck paintings will be on exhibit at this preview event with a portion of the proceeds going to the conservation of the S. S. Jones painting by Sheldon Peck, currently part of the St. Charles History Museum collection.

Richard Miller is a graduate of Columbia College Chicago where he received a B.A. in Film in 1978. After working on a freelance basis on approximately 100 motion picture and video productions, he attended the Cooperstown Graduate Program, State University of Oneonta, New York, and received an M.A. in Museum Studies in 1986.

From 1986-1995, Miller was Associate Curator, then Curator of Sculpture and Decorative Arts at the Abby Aldrich Rockefeller Folk Art Museum in Williamsburg, Virginia.

Since 1995 Miller has served as an independent curator and consultant to private and institutional clients, including The New Hampshire Historical Society, The Colonial Williamsburg Foundation, The Maier Museum of Art, The Hood Museum of Art, The Bennington Museum, and The Illinois State Museum. He continues to catalog the collections of furniture and ceramics at the Chipstone Foundation, as well as author articles and contribute essays on folk art.

November 29, 2018 - Lombard, IL - Lombard Historical Society members and volunteers were offered a first look at an original Sheldon Peck painting at the Society's annual Wassail event on Wednesday evening (Nov 28) at the Victorian Cottage on Maple Street. Volunteers and members are honored for their many contributions during the year by Board Members and Staff and are invited to enjoy unique "behind-the-scenes" experiences each year. This year they were delightfully surprised with a first-time look at a new acquisition to the Society, Portrait of a Gentleman, an original Peck painting. Victorian Cottage hours are Wednesday and Friday from 1 – 4 and 10 – 2 on Saturday. The Sheldon Peck Homestead is closed the months of December and January and the Victorian Cottage is closed the months of January and February. Little is known about the subject of *Portrait of a Gentleman* other than that it was painted in 1837 while Peck lived in Illinois. It was acquired at auction in 2018 from the Arthur and Sybil Kern Collection of American Folk Art and is on extended loan to the Lombard Historical Society from a private donor and will next be seen at the exhibition, *Sheldon Peck: Footsteps of His Life*, beginning June 4, 2019. The exhibition, from the collections of private donors and museums across the country, will include over a dozen original Peck paintings from 1825 - 1848. This first time ever presentation of many never before seen paintings will be displayed together in the Peck Homestead built in 1839.

Sheldon Peck, born in Cornwall, Vermont in 1797, was an itinerant portrait painter in Vermont, New York and several places in Illinois, where he eventually settled in Lombard, raised a family and lived out his life. As an itinerant painter, Peck's paintings were created "on location" and likely never stored or displayed at his home in Lombard.

The Lombard Historical Society is partnering with the DuPage County Convention & Visitors
Bureau to promote DuPage artist Sheldon Peck and the exhibition. Miriam Blumenthal, Director
of Marketing and Bureau Partnerships at DuPage Convention & Visitors Bureau and Nicole Aranas,
Assistant Village Manager of Lombard, arrived in time for a private pre-screening of the portrait.

Publicity / Photography: The Borrower may photograph or otherwise graphically reproduce the loaned objects for any purpose related to the loan. One copy of any photographs, publicity, or publication using the objects is to be given to the Lender at no charge.

Liability for Damage of Loss of Objects: Unless the Lender elects to maintain its own insurance, all loaned objects shall be insured by the Borrower for the duration of the loan period. The Borrower's liability for loss of injury to any object shall not exceed the value for it stated in this Agreement and shall not include consequential damages. If the Lender does not state a value, the Museum shall enter a value, and the Lender's recovery shall be limited to that value. If Lender maintains its own insurance, the Borrower must be furnished with a certificate of insurance naming the Lombard Historical Society as additional insured or waiving subrogation against the Borrower.

Care, Restoration, and Repair of Loaned Objects: The loaned objects will be cared for in accordance with their value, nature and condition, based upon the standard of care employed by museums of the size and kind of the Lombard Historical Society. No restoration, repair, or cleaning of objects will be performed by the Borrower without Lender's permission.

Return Shipment: The objects shall be returned in the containers provided by the Lender or other containers of the same kind. Returns shall be by the same mode of shipment as delivery.

Amendment of Loan Agreements: This agreement may be changed during the loan period by written agreement between the Borrower and the Lender.
