At last Monday's Economic and Community Development Committee meeting, the following actions were taken:

The ECDC unanimously approved a Downtown Renovation and Improvement Grant for the Brick's Wood Fired Pizza Restaurant tenant space at 130-132 W. St. Charles Road in the amount of \$1,200. The ECDC heard the request and presentation from the Lombard Town Centre regarding their Strategic Plan Activities as well as their funding request to the Village for their 2018 activities in the amount of \$50,000 which is \$5,000 less than last year.
