Title: Amending Title 11, Chapter 112, of the Lombard Village Code - Alcoholic Beverages
Amending Title 11, Chapter 112, Section 112.12(A) and Section 112.14(A) of the Lombard Village Code, Section 112.12(A) amends the Class "S" liquor license category description by allowing the sale and consumption of beer manufactured by the licensee off of the licensed premises; allowing spirits to be sold on the licensed premises for consumption on the licensed premises at special events, not open to the general public, or as a single "spirits drink of the day" to the general public; a kitchen offering food service to the public while the licensed premises is open for business (except the last hour) and allowing catered food to be brought in for special events not open to the public, Section 112.14(A) amends the license fee from \$750 to \$1,000.
