Interim Chief Bill Balling,

I would like to present the staff of Medic 61 and Engine 45 the "Excellence in Cardiac Care" heart pins for an outstanding job on a call dating April 5, 2010.

On April 5, 2010 Lombard Medic 61 was called for a patient having trouble breathing and chest pain. Upon assessment, they noticed the patient was having some abnormal cardiac arrhythmias and requested Engine 45 for assistance. Initial medical care was initiated and a 12-lead EKG was performed. While moving patient to the ambulance, he became unresponsive. Paramedic Vazquez performed a Precordal thump and the patient regained consciousness. Drug therapy was started and the patient once again went into several unstable cardiac rhythms and became unconscious. At this time, the patient received a shock (defibrillation) and returned to a sinus "stable" rhythm. Advanced Life Support care was continued during transport to Good Samaritan Hospital and the "Cardiac Alert" protocol was initiated.

Nine days after this call, the 40 year old male patient walked into our fire house to meet the men that saved him. There is no question that the actions taken by the paramedics on Medic 61 and Engine 45 were life saving measures. I would like to recognize the following individuals for their excellence in cardiac care.
