Subject: Garfield Site (Design, Construction Layout & Resident Engineering Services)

Attached please find a contract amendment and resolution pertaining to the engineering services agreement for the development of the Public Works facility at the north end of Garfield Street. This amendment affects the scope of services to be performed, but does not change the contract not-to-exceed amount.

In the fall of 2007, Christopher B. Burke Engineering, Ltd. (CBBEL) of Rosemont was selected to provide design, construction layout and resident engineering services for the project, not including the proposed salt dome or the operations building. Staff initially negotiated a scope and fee with CBBEL in the not-to-exceed amount of \$117,728.51. In 2008 the project was sent out for bid. However, all bids came in over budget and were rejected. Since that time the project has been on hold. During this time, the Village has been attempting to program the project into the CIP. If Legislative Initiative Funds become available, the project has the potential to be let and completed before the winter of 2011. If this is not the case, the project will be programmed into FY 2013 (June 2012 – May 2013).

From the time that bids were rejected until now, the Engineering and Operations Divisions have continued to discuss and review the plans and have concurred on the need for minor revisions and updates to the plans and specifications. Potential funding changes, specification revisions from IDOT and minor changes to the site plan (additional fencing, enlarging concrete pads, adding curb, add a street light by the entrance and exit and delineate areas on the site that may have a potential alternate use) are items needing to be addressed before the project is sent out for bid.

CBBEL has submitted a cost estimate in the amount of \$15,398.18. This amount and the associated hours represent the effort required to incorporate the requested changes to the bid package. Considering the uncertainty of when the project will be out for bid, it is recommended that the construction layout and Resident Engineering (construction inspection) portion of the contract be eliminated from the contract. The budget for those services could be utilized by offsetting the cost of the design revisions against the cost of construction layout and Resident Engineering services. The dollar value of construction layout and Resident Engineering portion of contract is \$25,362.75. When the project schedule is ready to be let, the Engineering Division intends to send out a proposal for construction layout and Resident Engineering services. It is anticipated the value for the contract will be in the range of \$30,000 to \$50,000, depending upon the scope of services (full or part time monitoring of construction) to be provided by the selected consultant.

Please present this agreement and resolution to the President and Board of Trustees for their review at their regular meeting of March 4, 2011. If approved, please have both signed copies returned to Public Works-Engineering for further processing.

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RESOLUTION R 11

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING A CHANGE ORDER INVOLVING AN INCREASE IN THE DOLLAR AMOUNT OF THE CONTRACT OF \$10,000 OR MORE

WHEREAS, pursuant to Illinois Compiled Statutes, Chapter 720, Section 5/33E-9, units of local government are required to make specific findings prior to authorizing any change order relative to a contract which would increase or decrease the dollar amount of the contract by \$10,000 or more, or would extend or shorten the time in which the contract is to be completed by thirty days or more; and

WHEREAS, staff has presented and recommended the proposed Change Order No. 1 to the contract between the Village of Lombard and Christopher B. Burke Engineering, Ltd. regarding Garfield Site (Design, Construction Layout and Resident Engineering) project, as attached hereto as Exhibit "A" and made part hereof, to the Corporate Authorities of the Village of Lombard; and

WHEREAS, said change order attached hereto as Exhibit "A" would increase the design engineering dollar amount of the contract by \$15,398.18 and eliminate the construction layout and resident engineering services portion of the contract (tasks 13-15) and keep the current contract at the not to exceed amount of \$117,728.51.



- B. That the basis of the change order was not within the contemplation of the contract when the contract was signed.
- C. That it is in the best interests of the Village of Lombard to approve the change order in its proposed form.
- D. That to the extent that it may have been necessary to go to bid relative to the work contemplated by said change order; bidding is hereby specifically waived as to the change order work.

Dear Mr. Schwab:

Please find attached a spreadsheet outlining estimated additional hours and fee to complete the subject project. The project design was originally completed and bid in 2008. However, bids were not accepted due to Village funding constraints. Plans were then revised in February of 2009 for potential re-bidding. Since then the project has been on hold until we recently met on January 13, 2011. It is our understanding that the Village has identified a new potential funding source and may rebid the project in the spring of 2011. At our January 13th meeting we reviewed the plans and discussed revisions and updates to the plans and specifications desired by the Village prior to rebidding (see the attached meeting minutes).

We understand that the Construction Observation portion of our contract will be eliminated due to the uncertainty of the funding, and thus, the construction start date. We will therefore use up to, but not exceed \$15,398.18 of our Construction Observation fee to complete the design changes.
