2014-2015 Winter Season Road Salt Purchase

On April 3, 2014 the Village Board approved the extension of the Illinois Joint purchase contract with Morton Salt Inc. for bulk road salt. The contract extension locked salt prices at last year's rate of \$51.69 per ton. The contract extension was approved for 2000 tons of salt with the option for 2400 tons.

The Village currently has approximately 4000 tons of salt in storage at the Keith J. Surges Center salt dome. An estimated 2000 tons of salt has been used to treat the roadways this season.

Staff is recommending the purchase of the 2400 tons of salt to complete the contract with Morton salt in the amount of \$124,056.00.

The purchase of any off-season salt will be in addition to the annual State of Illinois Joint Purchase bid.

Salt purchases will be paid for by the MFT fund 420.730.730.73310
