Lombard Meadow Parking Restrictions - Magnolia Circle & Cherry Lane

Request

Staff recommend amending Section 10-13-1 of the Traffic Code to establish parking restrictions on the north side of Magnolia Circle, from Cherry Lane to Lilac Way, and on the east side of Cherry Lane, from Wilson Avenue to the north dead end of the street (105' north of Magnolia Circle).

Background

The Lombard Meadow subdivision is adjacent to Madison Meadow Park. This proximity to the park results in vehicle trips and parking that are not related to the neighborhood residents. Specifically, Lombard Falcons Junior Football League practices and games. When there are vehicles parked on both sides of the roadway, it makes driveway ingress/egress difficult for residents, restricts turning movements at intersections, and presents access concerns for public safety vehicles.

As part the Lombard Meadow subdivision reconstruction, the roadway width along Lilac Way was reduced to the standard Village width of 28 feet from back of curb to back of curb. The first phase of that project was in July 2014. Following reconstruction, residents experienced the issues previously outlined and informed the Village. In response, the Village restricted parking in 2015 (no parking, any time) on the hydrant side of the street on: Chase Lane, Lodge Lane, and Lilac Way (see Exhibit A).

Resident Involvement & Feedback

This initiative was requested by residents on Magnolia Circle. Some of those residents were in attendance at the December 4, 2024 Public Safety & Transportation Committee meeting to voice their support for the proposed parking restrictions on Magnolia Circle and Cherry Lane.

The Committee suggested establishing similar parking restrictions along Hawthorne Circle, as parking may migrate to that street, and requested that staff reach out to the residents along Hawthrone Circle for their feedback. At the December 12, 2024 public meeting for the Village's Lombard Meadows Phase IV project (which includes Hawthorne Circle), Hawthorne Circle residents were asked their opinion on a proposed parking restriction. All residents on Hawthrone Circle were opposed to this measure. This is likely because they have not experienced many parking issues since Magnolia Circle and Cherry Lane currently allow parking on both sides of the street. In light of the resident feedback, Hawthorne Circle was not included in this proposed ordinance.

Analysis

The benefits of this parking restriction are identical to what was stated in 2015 with the original establishment of parking restrictions in the Lombard Meadows subdivision:

"The restriction will enhance emergency vehicle response and improve traffic flow during events at Madison Meadows Park. This restriction will ensure that emergency and regular traffic can flow effectively through this subdivision."

One concern that staff has is that the parking demand is due to the at activities at the park. With no changes to the programming, the existing parking demand will remain. Thus, any parking restrictions will likely shift the vehicles to another location. While we hope that more vehicles will park in the existing parking lots, there may be a future need to enact similar restrictions on Hawthorne Circle or other locations.

Staff will monitor the parking situation on Hawthorne Circle for the 2025 Lombard Falcons season, be responsive to resident feedback, and will consider parking restrictions, if necessary.

Staff will communicate the parking changes to the Lombard Park District and Lombard Falcons Junior Football organization about the parking restrictions.

In order to amend the Village Traffic Code, there are two required additions to Schedule VII:

SCHEDULE VII- PARKING PROHIBITED AT ALL TIMES ON CERTAIN STREETS



This recommendation was initially presented to the Public Safety and Transportation Committee at the December 4, 2024 meeting and was revisited at the February 5, 2025 meeting. The Committee supports the proposed amendment to the Lombard Traffic Code and requested that this matter be placed on the Village Board agenda for the February 20, 2025 for consideration.

Recommendation

Staff recommend amending Section 10-13-1 of the Village Traffic Code to establish parking prohibitions on the north side of Magnolia Circle from Cherry Lane to Lilac Way and the east side of Cherry Lane from Wilson Avenue to the north dead end of street.

ORDINANCE AMENDING ARTICLE XIII OF THE LOMBARD TRAFFIC CODE TO ADD PARKING PROHIBITIONS ON MAGNOLIA CIRCLE AND CHERRY LANE

WHEREAS, the President and Board of Trustees of the Village of Lombard have heretofore passed and approved Ordinance 1186, An Ordinance Regulating Traffic in the Village of Lombard (hereinafter the Lombard Traffic Code); and

WHEREAS, the President and Board of Trustees of the Village of Lombard find that the Lombard Traffic Code has been amended from time to time; and

WHEREAS, the Public Safety and Transportation Committee has reviewed the appropriate traffic studies and recommends certain changes to the Lombard Traffic Code; and

WHEREAS, the Corporate Authorities of the Village of Lombard concur in the recommendation of the Transportation and Safety Committee.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE PRESIDENT AND BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE VILLAGE OF LOMBARD, DU PAGE COUNTY, ILLINOIS, as follows:

Section 1: That Article XIII, Schedule VII, of the Lombard Traffic Code (Ordinance 1186) be amended by adding the language as follows:
