Subject: Fire Hydrant Painting Bid

Background

There are 2778 hydrants in Lombard. Most of the hydrants in the Village have not been painted in 20 years and look very bad. The corrosion on some hydrants is so significant it has warranted replacing the lower barrel section. Hydrants close to the road are particularly affected by salt. American Water Works Association (AWWA) and the hydrant manufacturer recommend that hydrants are painted when they exhibit signs of corrosion. although aesthetics dictate the painting schedule in many communities. Staff has developed a plan to paint all of the hydrants within five years. The attached map shows the Village divided into five areas with roughly equal number of hydrants per area. The future schedule for recoating hydrants could be determined by evaluating the condition of the hydrants that were painted in the Spring, 2008 because that project contained a selection of hydrants located high traffic, highly salted roads and residential streets. The project was located on Highland Ave south of 22nd St., 22nd St. from Main St east to Convention Way and the Majestic/Janata area. It is estimated that the hydrants on priority roads will need recoating sooner than the hydrants on residential streets because the hydrants are typically closer to the roadways and exposed to more salt.

The Fire Hydrant Painting Program is funded in the Water & Sewer Operations and Maintenance Fund. The Village has not painted hydrants in five years for various reasons, including the low funding (\$25,000) and single year contracts that do not attract competitive bids. The low bid price per hydrant in FY 07/08 for Lombard's single year contract was \$88. By comparison, in January, 2012 Downers Grove awarded a 3-year contract to paint approximately 500 fire hydrants per year for \$72, \$73, \$74 per hydrant per year.

Staff proposes increasing the funding for the fire hydrant painting program through partially funding the program with the Water & Sewer Capital Reserve Fund Water Maintenance & Improvements Project for a total annual budget of \$50,000. There is available funding for this work to be performed through this mechanism. The Village Attorney recommended bidding the project as a one year contract with an option to renew for an additional four years

due to the use of funds from the Water & Sewer Operations and Maintenance Fund which the Board approves annually.

As the bid was being written, staff also considered alternatives for contracting out the work. One of the options was to use Fire Department personnel to paint the hydrants. They would use a crew of on-duty personnel with at least one person on overtime to continue the work if the on-duty crew had to respond to a call. It was decided to bid the work and then compare a contractor's cost to in-house costs.

Bids were opened on April 23, 2013 for fire hydrant painting. The three contractors submitted bids and the results are as follows:

Colour Revue has been in business for ten years performing commercial and industrial sandblasting and painting. They have bid on several fire hydrant painting projects but have yet to be awarded a contract for fire hydrant painting. They have not worked for the Village previously. They received very good recommendations from several references. Therefore, staff recommends that the Village enter into a one-year contract with Colour Revue to sandblast and paint 530 fire hydrants in an amount not to exceed \$29,293.10. The bid also included pricing for the four subsequent years should the Village exercise the four one-year contract renewals. The pricing for the four subsequent years is \$56.09, \$56.94, \$57.79 and \$58.66 per hydrant per year.

Based upon the bid results, it is more cost effective to contract out this work rather than use Fire Department personnel. The fire hydrant painting work will be funded using \$25,000 budgeted in the Water & Sewer Operations and Maintenance Fund and \$4,293.10 from the Water & Sewer Capital Reserve Fund Water Maintenance & Improvements Project.

Recommendation

Staff recommends the Village Board award a one-year contract to Colour Revue of Verona, IL to sandblast and paint 530 fire hydrants in an amount not to exceed \$29,293.10 at their May 16, 2013 meeting.

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
