## 2025 Lilac Sale – Print/Posters/Email Media

The print media portion of marketing the Lilac Sale consisted of writing, distributing and securing placement for articles about the Sale in local news outlets. Information was published in the Daily Herald, the Lombardian, the Patch and Suburban News (formerly the Lombard Spectator). Press releases were also sent to the Chicago Sun-Times, the Chicago Tribune and Pioneer Press.

Print media remains an important segment of any marketing campaign as it strengthens community involvement and the information often has a higher credibility with no virus worry. Consumers who read content in print have a longer attention span and the “staying power” of print is longer with publications being kept on hand, shared with others and referred to in the future.

## YOUTH ACTIVITIES

It's winter and our gardens outside have closed down, but that doesn't mean that we can't still work with youth. Grab a bunch of flowers from the grocery store or other fairly inexpensive places and have a design workshop. Scan garden catalogs and plan out a garden of favorite vegetables and research their growing needs and problems. Search the web or cookbooks for a new recipe to try to use them and plan a cooking day. Make a list of local garden centers/greenhouses and plan a trip to see how they get ready for the spring rush. Have each person identify their favorite color and then do a scavenger hunt through garden catalogs to find plant varieties that show that color. Do some winter sowing in milk jugs or propagate some houseplants. So many ideas can be obtained on YouTube or if you're into long term lesson plans or activities for an organized youth garden club, you can check out [Kidsgardening.org](http://Kidsgardening.org).

Another idea is to paint small rocks or flower pots and then use them to enhance

a small houseplant that can be taken to a senior home and given to a grandparent and then have a conversation of their gardening experience as a child. Or just have an Invite a Neighbor Day and have them share gardening topics like favorite flowers or their garden stories over cookies and hot chocolate. Read one of the many wonderful children's stories that pertain to gardening and plan a correlated activity. Your local librarian or the internet have numerous suggestions.

There are so many fun, yet learning, things that can be done with children to instill a love of gardening and nature. Don't be hesitant. Just jump in and you'll be amazed at how much fun you will have, too.

As an added topic, don't forget that the entries for the Smokey Bear or Woodsy Owl Posters, Sculpture, Poetry, and Essay Contests are due to me by January 20th. Your club judges your entries and sends me the winners' entries only, plus the names of all the participants. Everyone receives a participant certificate. The posters have to be mailed, but the others can be emailed. All information can be found on the National Garden Club, Inc. website under YOUTH CONTESTS. Looking forward to lots of entries.

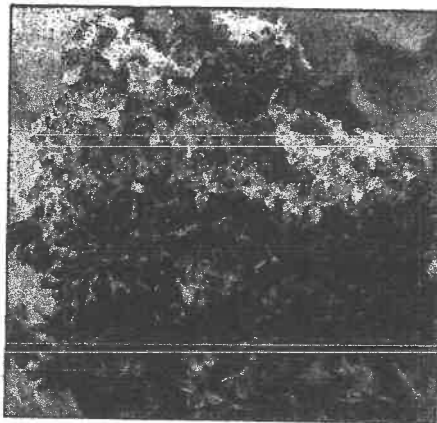

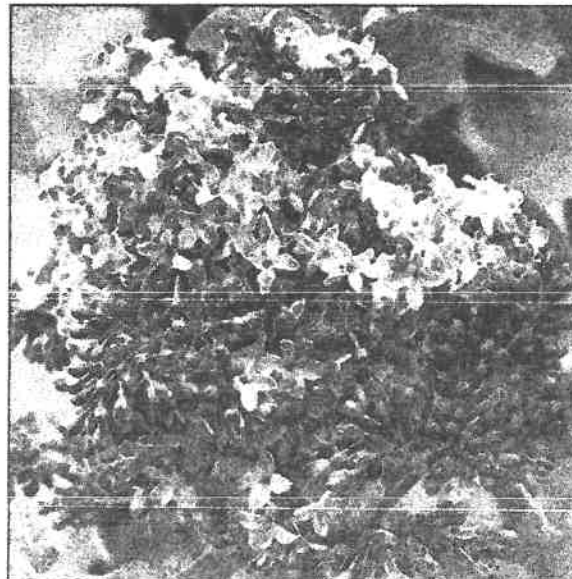

The area's largest lilac sale, in Lombard, will be held on Thursday, May 8, in Lilacia Park (near the Metra station) from noon until 7 p.m. or sold out. You may choose from 19 different lilacs of varying sizes. Colors of the blooms range from deep violet, magenta and lilac to pink, blue and white. Proceeds support the Lombard Garden Club's scholarship program, community beautification projects and educational outreach about the environment and gardening in our region. This week's feature is Declaration (*Syringa xhyacinthiflora*). The name refers to the U. S. Declaration of Independence, July 4, 1776. It is an early bloomer, fragrant with magenta and purple flowers. Fast growing, it reaches a height of 6'-8' and a spread of 6'-7'. It is similar to "Old Glory" with green foliage and it is one of 19 cultivars available at the Lombard Garden Club Lilac Sale. ## Meet 'Saugeana'

This week's feature is Saugeana (*Syringa xchinensis*). It is named for Pierre Sauge, a florist and originator of the cultivar. This lilac grows to 10-12 feet tall and has a 5-10 foot spread. It blooms mid-season, is quite fragrant and has pinkish-purple blossoms. This cultivar and 18 others are for sale on Thursday, May 8, at the area's largest lilac sale in Lombard, in Lilacia Park near the Metra station from noon until 7 pm or sold out. You may choose from 19 different lilacs of varying sizes. Colors of the blooms range from deep violet, magenta and lilac to pink, blue and white. 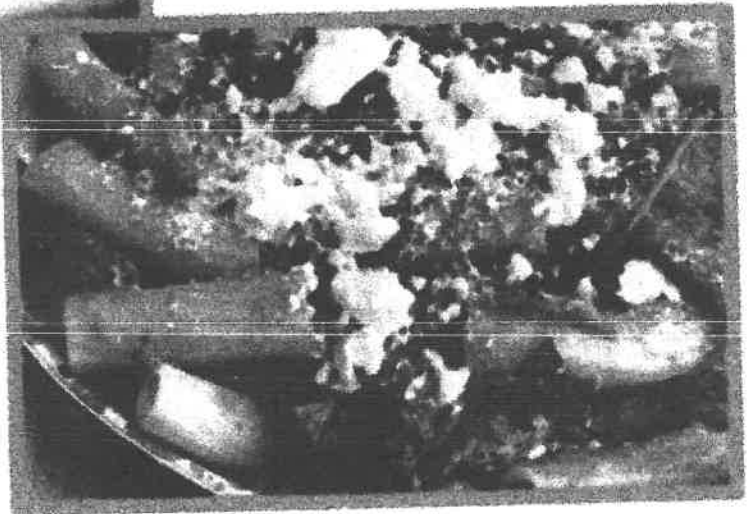
