#### **New Vehicle**

On August 18, the Village of Lombard has placed a new 2025 Pierce Enforcer Pumper Fire Engine into service at Fire Station 45. This state-of-the-art engine represents a significant investment in operational readiness, firefighter safety, and our continued commitment to serving the Lombard community. Engine 45 is equipped with upgraded safety systems, enhanced firefighting technology, and improved ergonomics for our personnel.

## **FIRE DEPARTMENT NEWS**

#### **Weekend Storms**

On August 16 and 17, storms rolled through Lombard resulting in several incidents.

- Cruise Nights had a delayed start due to the first line of storms, and then was ultimately cancelled as the second line of storms approached.
- There were 10 incidents related to down power lines
- E45 extinguished a fire inside a large hollowed-out Catalpa tree after being struck by lightning.
- Several AFA's and a reported structure fire occurred in the overnight hours; caused by downed wires and power outages.
- Engine 44 investigated a melted solar panel that shorted out after sustaining damage from a fallen tree limb.

Overall the crews were busy throughout the evening and overnight hours handling these responses. We also provided assistance to Downers Grove, Oak Brook, Oakbrook Terrace, and Villa Park Fire Departments; and received assistance from Oak Brook and Villa Park Fire Departments.
