Subject: Elizabeth St. Quad Gates – Stipulated Agreement

The project will upgrade the crossing gates at Elizabeth Street and the railroad tracks to a quad gates system. The project is collaboration between the Village of Lombard, the Illinois Commerce Commission (ICC) and the Union Pacific Railroad (UPRR) in efforts to improve public safety for at-grade railroad crossings.

The project scope includes roadway and pedestrian railroad gates at all quadrants of the intersection. The crossing will be rebuilt, and detection loops will be placed in the pavement between the gates to detect vehicles on the railroad tracks. Sidewalk improvements and safety pavement markings also are addressed in the project.

After sending an application packet to the ICC, the Village received a Stipulated Agreement 1788 dated August 1, 2014 with the ICC, UPRR, and Illinois Department of Transportation. The Agreement is within Village scope and budget.

This work will be performed for an agreed portion of Village funding of \$104,470. The costs will be paid through the Capital Project Fund. The CIP budgets \$111,500 for Construction.

Please present this agreement and resolution for Stipulated Agreement to the President and Board of Trustees for their review at their regular meeting of September 4, 2014. If approved, please return two original signed copies of the agreement to Public Works Engineering for further processing.

STATE OF ILLINOIS ILLINOIS COMMERCE COMMISSION STIPULATED AGREEMENT 1788

This Agreement made and entered into, by and between the State of Illinois acting by and through the Illinois Commerce Commission (Commission), the Union Pacific Railroad (Company), the Village of Lombard (Village), and the State of Illinois, Department of Transportation (Department or IDOT).

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, it has come to the attention of the Commission through correspondence that inquiry should be made into the matter of improving public safety at the Elizabeth Street highway-rail grade crossing (AAR/DOT #174 944W, railroad milepost 20.11-CNWA) of the Union Pacific Railroad Company's tracks, in the Village of Lombard, Du Page County.

WHEREAS, proper investigation has been made of the circumstances surrounding the subject crossing by a representative of the Commission's Transportation Division Railroad Section; and

WHEREAS, the physical aspects, including geometrics of the intersection, train movements, vehicular traffic volume, and other pertinent data relating to the crossings have been obtained and shown on Exhibit A, attached to this Agreement; and

WHEREAS, the parties are mutually agreeable to accomplish proposed improvements to the crossing upon determination of the Commission by Order.

NOW, THEREFORE in consideration of the premises and of the mutual covenants and agreements as hereinafter contained the parties pray that the Commission enter an Order according to the provisions of Section 18c-7401 of the Illinois Commercial Transportation Law, 625 ILCS 5/18(c)-7401, requiring that certain improvements as hereinafter stated be made and that the cost for the proposed improvements be divided among the parties according to law and that in the interest of the traveling public the Grade Crossing Protection Fund (GCPF) of the Motor Fuel Tax Law (MFT) be required to bear a substantial portion of the cost; To Wit the parties agree as follows:

<u>Section 1</u> All improvements encompassed by this Agreement shall be made in accordance with all applicable State laws, rules, standards, regulations and orders and procedures in general.

<u>Section 2</u> The parties are of the opinion that the following improvements in the interest of public safety at the aforesaid crossings should be:

- (a) Installation of a demonstration four quadrant gate system at the Elizabeth Street grade crossing, by the Company.
- (b) Completion of roadway work with renewal of the existing surface at the Elizabeth Street grade crossing per Exhibit B, by the Company.

Section 3 To facilitate the installation of the four quadrant gate system, the crossing surface will be reconstructed with new track and concrete panels by the Company. For ease of installation and limiting potential conflicts, the Company will also complete the roadway work and detector loop installation in conjunction with the renewal of the crossing surface. Staff of the Commission, in coordination with the Company and Village, has completed roadway plans for the Elizabeth Street crossing, attached herein as Exhibit B. The Company has prepared a preliminary cost estimate, attached and incorporated herein by reference as Exhibit C, to install the four quadrant gate system and accomplish the proposed railroad warning device improvements and associated roadway and track work, which may be required by Commission Order.

The Company shall upon a Commission Order, according to the requirements contained therein, prepare and submit duplicate copies of detailed drawings, detailed circuit plans, and any required specifications for the proposed improvements for the approval of the Commission. The Company agrees that an appropriate time for the submission of warning device plans should be one (1) month from the date of a Commission Order approving this Agreement.

The demonstration project will evaluate the four quadrant gate system operating in dynamic mode with vehicle detection and exit gate control equipment within a triple track commuter and freight environment. In addition, the project will evaluate the operation of the four quadrant gate system in relation to the traffic signal at the intersection of Elizabeth Street and St. Charles Road, which is interconnected to the railroad warning devices.

<u>Section 4</u> The Company shall upon Order, according to the requirements contained therein, proceed toward the completion of the proposed improvements, accomplishing the work with its own forces or appropriate contracted services and agrees that an appropriate time for the completion of the proposed improvements should be November 30, 2014.

<u>Section 5</u> The parties agree that an equitable division of cost for the proposed improvements is as follows:

Notes:

- Total Grade Crossing Protection Fund (GCPF) assistance for installation not to exceed \$325,186; any installation costs above the estimated amount of \$429,656 will be assigned to the GCPF upon submittal and review of evidence to support the additional cost and subject to approval by the Commission;
- 2. The Company shall be responsible for all maintenance costs associated with the entire four quadrant gate system. For future actual costs incurred for maintenance of the in-pavement inductive detector loops, in accordance with Public Act 96-0034, the Company may request reimbursement from the GCPF. Payment would then be authorized through a subsequent order(s) upon submittal and review of evidence to support the maintenance costs, and subject to approval by the Commission.
- 3. Company shall be responsible for all future operating and maintenance costs associated with the new automatic warning devices and circuitry;
- Company will be responsible for construction of the work detailed in Exhibit B in conjunction with the crossing surface renewal. Upon completion, the Village shall be responsible for the maintenance of the roadway, fencing, and swing gates;
- 5. GCPF assistance to provide reimbursement for material costs associated with the crossing surface renewal; Company responsible for labor costs.

<u>Section 6</u> Special Provisions: The Company shall complete and submit the Project Manager Information portion of the Project Status Report sheet, attached as Exhibit D, along with this executed Agreement.

The Company shall, at six (6) month intervals from the date of the Commission Order approving this Agreement, submit to the Director of Processing and Information, Transportation Bureau of the Commission, the Project Status Report, attached as Exhibit D, regarding the progress it has made toward completion of the work required by this Agreement. Each Project Status Report shall include the Commission Order's docket number, the Order date, the project completion date as noted in the Order, crossing information (inventory number and railroad milepost), type of improvement, and the name, title, mailing address, phone number, facsimile number, and electronic mailing address of the Company Project Manager.

All bills for work specified in Section 2 of this Agreement authorized for reimbursement from the Grade Crossing Protection Fund shall be submitted to the Fiscal Control Unit, Bureau of Local Roads and Streets, Illinois Department of Transportation, 2300 S. Dirksen Parkway, Springfield, IL 62764. The Department shall send a copy of all invoices to the Director of Processing and Information, Transportation Bureau of the Commission. All bills shall be submitted no later than twelve (12) months from the completion date specified in

the Commission Order approving this Agreement. The final bill for expenditures from each party shall be clearly marked "Final Bill". The Department shall not obligate any assistance from the Grade Crossing Protection Fund for the cost of proposed improvements described in this Agreement without prior approval by the Commission. The Commission shall, at the end of the 12th month from the completion date specified in the Commission Order approving this Agreement or any Supplemental Order(s) issued for this project, notify the Department to de-obligate all residual funds accountable for this project. Notification may be by regular mail, electronic mail, fax, or phone.

<u>SECTION 7</u> Billing: For all work specified in Section 2 of this Agreement, and authorized by an Order of the Commission, the Company shall assure that sufficient documentation for all bills is made available for review by the Department or the Department's representative. The <u>minimum</u> documentation that must be made available is outlined below:

- a) <u>Labor Charges (including additives)</u> Copies of employee work hours charged to the railroad account code for the project.
- b) <u>Equipment Rental</u> Copies of rental agreements for the equipment used, including the rental rate; number of hours the equipment was used and the railroad account code for the project.
- c) <u>Material</u> An itemized list of all materials purchased and installed at the crossing location. If materials purchased are installed at multiple crossing locations, a notation must be made to identify the crossing location.
- d) <u>Engineering</u> Copies of employee work hours charged to the railroad account code for the project.
- e) <u>Supervision</u> Copies of employee work hours charged to the railroad account code for the project.
- f) <u>Incidental Charges</u> An itemized list of all incidental charges along with a written explanation of those charges.
- g) <u>Service Dates</u> Invoice shall include the beginning and ending date of the work accomplished for the invoice.
- h) <u>Final or Progressive</u> Each invoice shall be marked as a Progressive or a Final Invoice.
- Reference Numbers Each invoice shall include the AAR/DOT number, the ICC order number and the state job number when federal funds are involved.
- j) <u>Locations</u> Each invoice shall show the location, with the street name and AAR/DOT crossing inventory number.

<u>Section 8</u> This Agreement shall be binding upon the parties hereto, their successors or assigns. Upon execution of this Agreement by all parties, the Commission shall enter an appropriate Order, within 60 days accepting or rejecting such stipulation according to the provisions contained herein.






PEDESTRIAN VIEW AT EXIT GATE - TRAIN APPROACHING



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
