SUBJECT: Ordinance Amending Section 50.039 of the Lombard Village Code

BACKGROUND/POLICY IMPLICATIONS:

The Department of Public Works transmits for your consideration a proposed ordinance to amend Section 50.039 of the Village Code. Section 50.039 pertains to the use of the Village's Sanitary Sewer System. The amendments to the Code are in relation to Industrial Pretreatment Standards and the establishment of local limits for specific discharges. These changes are mandated by the USEPA in accordance with the limits established for the Glenbard Wastewater Authority operating permit.

SUBJECT: Ordinance Amending Section 50.039 of the Lombard Village Code

Section 50.039 of the Village Code provides regulations for the discharge of industrial waste discharges into the Village's sanitary sewer system. The amendment proposed reflects changes in the established local limits for specific chemicals. Based upon a review by the USEPA, it has been determined that several of the established local limits for discharge should be amended. These changes are required as a condition of the operating permit issued by the USEPA to the Glenbard Wastewater Authority (GWA). The GWA has conducted the required public notification for the local limit amendment. A copy of the posting in the April 9, 2025 Daily Herald has been attached. The proposed changes are as follows:

§ 50.039 Limitations on certain discharges.

Discharges from each separate discharge of a user, as measured under the provisions of this Chapter, shall not contain in excess of the following concentrations based upon a 24-hour composite sample, or from a grab sample, where indicated. Multiple industrial wastewater discharges from a permitted facility may be combined in a flow weighted manner to determine compliance with the following limitations.

Cadmium	5.0 1.0	mg/L
Chromium (tot)	1.5	mg/L
Copper	2.0	mg/L
Cyanide	0.34 0.3	mg/L

Mercury	0.0005	mg/L
Nickel	2.0	mg/L
Oil & Grease	100	mg/L
Selenium	1.30	mg/L
Silver	0.1 1.2	mg/L
Zinc	7.0 3.9	mg/L
pH (pH Units)	5.5-10.0	Mg/L

Compliance with the limits listed herein is mandatory for all industrial users. The POTW shall make annual reports to the village recommending amendments to the specific limitations, as necessary to protect the POTW.

Recommendation:

The Public Works Department recommends that the Board of Trustees adopt AN ORDINANCE AMENDING TITLE 5, CHAPTER 50, SECTION 50.039 OF THE LOMBARD VILLAGE CODE IN REGARD TO THE REGULATIONS APPLICABLE TO THE USE OF THE SANITARY SEWER SYSTEM.

POTW Pretreatment Program
The Ozark-Warrior Water Authority has requested approval of a modification to its Industrial Pretreatment Program (IPP). The proposed modification consists of the modification of the Authority's local limits for the following parameters:
Ammonia Current Limit = 6.0 mg/L, Proposed Limit = 13 mg/L
Cadmium Current Limit = 1.0 mg/L, Proposed Limit = 12 mg/L
Cyanide Current Limit = 0.3 mg/L, Proposed Limit = 0.3 mg/L
Nickel Current Limit = 0.3 mg/L, Proposed Limit = 0.3 mg/L
Silver Current Limit = 0.1 mg/L, Proposed Limit = 12 mg/L
Zinc Current Limit = 18 mg/L, Proposed Limit = 30 mg/L
The United States Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) Region 5 has processed and approved the proposed modification. The proposed determination is tentative.
Interested persons are invited to submit written comments on the proposed program modification. Copies of the relevant POTW documents are available for inspection and copies at the EPA, and at Ozark-Warrior Water Authority 646 Barris Road, Olen, Illinois 61851. Comments should be submitted by person or mail no later than 30 days from the date of this Public Notice. Deliver or mail all requests or comments to the EPA at the address listed in this Public Notice (Attention: Andrew Schaefer).
Any person may request a public hearing, within 30 days of the date of this Public Notice. Submitting a written request to EPA, Region 5. The request shall state the interest of the person. If such request and the reasons why a hearing is warranted. A public hearing will be held if there is a significant degree of public interest in the proposed program modification. Public notice of such a hearing will be included in the newspaper and to the parties requesting the hearing.
If no comments to this notice are received, the proposed IPP modification will be approved as set forth herein without changes, and without further public notice. In such event, this notice shall constitute the notice of approval or disapproval required by Title 4 of the Code of Federal Regulations, Section 401.11 (c) and no additional notice shall be provided. In addition, the approved modification will be incorporated in the POTW's IPP. The permit by the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency. Anyone who wishes to be sent a notice of the approval of the modification, should send a request for such notice to the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency.

**AN ORDINANCE AMENDING TITLE V, CHAPTER 50,
SECTION 50.039 OF THE LOMBARD VILLAGE CODE
IN REGARD TO LIMITATIONS ON CERTAIN DISCHARGES FOR INDUSTRIAL
WASTEWATER PRETREATMENT STANDARDS AND REQUIREMENTS**

BE IT ORDAINED by the President and Board of Trustees of the Village of Lombard, DuPage County, Illinois, as follows:

SECTION 1: That Title V, Chapter 50, Section 50.039 of the Lombard Village Code is hereby amended in its entirety as follows:

§ 50.039 Limitations on certain discharges.

Discharges from each separate discharge of a user, as measured under the provisions of this Chapter, shall not contain in excess of the following concentrations based upon a 24-hour composite sample, or from a grab sample, where indicated. Multiple industrial wastewater discharges from a permitted facility may be combined in a flow weighted manner to determine compliance with the following limitations.

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Mercury	0.0005	mg/L
Nickel	2.0	mg/L
Selenium	1.3	mg/L
Silver	1.2	mg/L
Zinc	3.9	mg/L
pH (pH Units)	5.5-10.0	Mg/L
