As part of the Greenest Region Compact, the Metropolitan Mayors Caucus has developed a new Community Solar Clearinghouse Solution (CS<sup>2</sup>) program. This program allows residents in participating communities to share in electricity generated by regional solar arrays, and then receive credits with a guaranteed rebate in their ComEd rate. The only obligations to the Village are to pass a resolution endorsing the program, request ComEd's customer mailing list, and then provide information on the program to residents. The only cost to the Village is a \$200 fee to ComEd.

#### **Background:**

The Board of Trustees signed onto the Greenest Region Compact in 2008 to join with other local governments in Northeastern Illinois to work cooperatively toward sustainability goals. The Village's Sustainability Framework was created at that time to comprehensively set goals and record progress in that effort. Decreasing greenhouse gas emmissions is one of the goals in the Framework.

Slides on the  $CS^2$  program are attached. The Power Bureau is the  $CS^2$  program administrator, and also a marketing and sales designee authorized by the Illinois Power Agency. The billing administrator is mc<sup>2</sup>. The Illinois Power Agency administers the State's Adjustable Block Program, which was established by the Future Energy Jobs Act, P.A. 99-0906, eff. 6/1/17. All customer questions are directed to The Power Bureau so there would be no burden on Village Staff.

There is no cost to residents to sign up or to terminate involvement, and the average residential customer receives an annual rebate of about \$100. Growing participation in the program will support the construction of additional solar arrays. Municipalities play a role by helping with promotion, and also by demonstrating legitimacy to skeptical customers. Communities that are currently part of the CS<sup>2</sup> program include Lake Forest, Highland Park, Lake Bluff, Glencoe, Deerfield, Northbrook, Oak Park and Skokie. There are no communities in DuPage County actively participating yet.

All municipalities in the ComEd service area are eligible to participate. However, the program will eventually be limited by the capacity of the existing solar arrays. The Village may opt to enroll its own billable ComEd accounts in the program, although that is not required.

#### **Recommendation:**

The Public Works & Environmental Concerns Committee has voted to recommend that the Board of Trustees formally endorse the CS<sup>2</sup> program by resolution.

# SAMPLE COMMERCIAL TERMS FOR CS<sup>2</sup> COMMUNITY SOLAR PROGRAM

The commercial terms outlined below were adopted by the first communities to use the CS<sup>2</sup> Program for their resident (e.g., Village of Oak Park, North Shore Consortium). The CS<sup>2</sup> Program secured commitments from community solar developers to offer a limited volume of subscriptions that met these terms.

#### <u>A RESOLUTION ENDORSING THE COMMUNITY SOLAR</u> <u>CLEARINGHOUSE SOLUTION PROGRAM</u>

WHEREAS, the Metropolitan Mayors Caucus provides a forum for the chief elected officials of northeastern Illinois to develop consensus and act on common public policy issues and multi-jurisdictional challenges; and

WHEREAS, the Metropolitan Mayors Caucus has a history of environmental stewardship, including energy efficiency, water conservation, urban forestry, and leadership of the Greenest Region Compact initiative; and

WHEREAS, the Village of Lombard signed onto the Greenest Region Compact in 2008, and has since actively participated in regional meetings and activities that advance sustainability goals; and

WHEREAS, to facilitate local support of new solar development in Illinois, the Metropolitan Mayors Caucus created the Community Solar Clearinghouse Solution Program (the "Program") that allows residents to subscribe in shared solar electricity generated in Illinois without the need to install solar panels on their properties; and

WHEREAS, participating residents may reduce their total cost of electricity supply by receiving net metering credits on their monthly utility bills; and

WHEREAS, the Program will assist the Village in its ongoing effort to provide residents with access to sustainable energy solutions that enhance the quality of life along with stewardship of the environment and sustainable economic vitality; and

WHEREAS, the Village's Public Works and Environmental Concerns Committee has recommended the endorsement of the Community Solar Clearinghouse Solution Program;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE PRESIDENT AND BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE VILLAGE OF LOMBARD, DU PAGE COUNTY, ILLINOIS as follows:

**SECTION 1:** That the Community Solar Clearinghouse Solution Program is endorsed, and the Village will educate and inform residents regarding its availability.

**SECTION 2:** That the Village Manager or designee is authorized to execute any necessary documents for participation in the Program.
