**AN ORDINANCE AMENDING TITLE XI, CHAPTER 112,
SECTION 112.13(A) OF THE LOMBARD VILLAGE CODE TO REDUCE THE NUMBER
OF AVAILABLE LIQUOR LICENSES IN THE
CLASS “E-VG” LIQUOR LICENSE CATEGORY**

**BE IT ORDAINED BY THE PRESIDENT AND BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE
VILLAGE OF LOMBARD, DU PAGE COUNTY, ILLINOIS** as follows:

SECTION 1: That Title XI, Chapter 112, Section 112.13(A) of the Lombard Village Code is amended by revising the entry relative to the Class “E-VG” liquor licenses, contained therein, to read as follows:

Class “E-VG” – 0

SECTION 3: That the decrease in the number of Class “E-VG” liquor licenses as set forth in Sections 1 above is a result of Glass Court Club, Inc. d/b/a Glass Court Swim & Fitness no longer conducting business at 830 E. Roosevelt Road, Lombard, IL 60148.

SECTION 4: This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and approval as required by law.

SUBJECT: Liquor License
Glass Court Club, Inc. d/b/a Glass Court Swim & Fitness
830 E. Roosevelt Road – No Longer Conducting Business

Glass Court Club, Inc. d/b/a Glass Court Swim & Fitness located at 830 E. Roosevelt Road, currently holds a Class “E-VG” liquor license. The owner officially notified the Village, April 8, 2025, and confirmed that the establishment is closed and no longer conducting business at 830 E. Roosevelt Road, effective March 30, 2025.

Attached is an Ordinance reflecting the decrease in the “E-VG” Liquor License Class and terminating the liquor license issued to Glass Court Club, Inc. d/b/a Glass Court Swim & Fitness, located at 830 E. Roosevelt Road, pursuant to Title XI, Chapter 112, Section 112.27 of the Lombard Village Code:

§ 112.27 - Cessation of business.

In the event a licensee ceases to do business at the licensed premises, other than temporarily for a period of not to exceed 45 successive days, for purposes of remodeling, or for purposes other than remodeling but with the prior written approval of the Local Liquor Control Commissioner, the number of authorized licenses in the particular class shall automatically be reduced by one at the time the licensee ceases to do business. If any licensee desires to close the business or place of business for more than 45 successive days, said licensee shall so notify the Local Liquor Commissioner in writing, including the reasons therefor and requesting an extension, and the Liquor Control Commissioner may grant such an extension on a showing of good cause. The Local Liquor Commissioner shall notify in writing the Village Clerk and Board of Trustees of any cessation of business by a license, in excess of 45 days, within ten days of such occurrence.

Staff is requesting a waiver of first reading in order to bring the number of entries in the Liquor License Class “E-VG” current.
