All classrooms at Chicagoland Academy recycle paper. We have bins in the kitchen and near the copier. We re-use the backs of paper as scrap paper. We use SCARCE for several items. Parents have donated old computers from their workplace. On Oct. 12, we will be receiving office equipment like bookcases, file cabinets, chairs, etc. from one of our parents work place.

Part 2 - g.

Some of the teachers will be teaching a recycling lesson this year as part of the children's program. We will repeat 2 projects we did last year, 1) In the spring the older students will be scheduling a clean-up day where they will remove debris from a local park or neighborhood and 2) the younger students will be planting flowers in the spring. Last year we bought 2 picnic tables, one for each school location and 2 new garbage cans from our recycling grant money. These types of things enhance the Village of Lombard by making it more pleasing to the eyes.

Part 3 - c.

We currently reside in two locations (main location on Roosevelt Road and Faith United Methodist Church on Finley Road) so we would like 2 of some things. The mulch, barricades, traffic cones and signs are made from recyclable plastic. The barricades are equal to 350 milk jugs and the signs are equal to 60 milk jugs.
