## **USBC Women's Championships 2021**

The United States Bowling Congress Women's Championships, a national event open to all female USBC members, dates to 1916 when eight teams took to the lanes in St. Louis. The tournament, now the largest annual participatory sporting event in the world for women, offers bowlers of all ages and skills the chance to compete for a national title in an event filled with tradition as well as fun.

As the result of a competitive bid process led by the DuPage CVB and Stardust Bowl of Addison, **primarily against tier-1 destinations nationwide**, USBC announced the return of the Women's Championships to the Chicago region for the **first time since 1935**. "Participants have asked us to take the Women's Championship to venues throughout the country, particularly the Midwest, and we will make that happen over the next four years," USBC Executive Director Chad Murphy said. "Stardust Bowl knows what it takes to deliver a successful and, along with the DuPage CVB will be gracious hosts when the Women's Championship hits the Chicago area."

#### Participant Profile

The Women's Championships features a multi-division scratch format based on average. Bowlers compete in team, doubles and singles events. Bowlers usually take part in the three game team event the first day and one round of three doubles and three singles games the next.

The USBC member is an affluent, educated consumer with a strong lifestyle profile. Bowler demographics are on par with other popular sport marketing target audiences including auto racing, baseball and golf.
