EXECUTIVE ORDER NO. 2020-02

EXECUTIVE ORDER REGARDING THE TEMPORARY CESSATION OF BUSINESS BY A LIQUOR LICENSEE UNDER A DECLARATION OF A STATE OF EMERGENCY IN THE VILLAGE OF LOMBARD, DUPAGE COUNTY, ILLINOIS

(COVID-19 - MARCH 20, 2020)

WHEREAS, the Village of Lombard (the "Village") is a non-home rule unit of local government, as provided by Article VII, Section 7 of the Illinois Constitution of 1970; and

WHEREAS, COVID-19 is a dangerous disease which has spread around the world, including in the United States, the State of Illinois and DuPage County; and

WHEREAS, COVID-19 is a direct and serious threat to the public's health, safety and welfare; and

WHEREAS, on March 20, 2020, the Village President declared a state of emergency in the Village in Declaration 2020-1, entitled "Declaration of a State of Emergency in the Village of Lombard, DuPage County, Illinois (COVID-19 – March 20, 2020)" (the "Declaration"); and

WHEREAS, the Declaration was made pursuant to authority granted to the Village President in Section 31.18 of the Lombard Village Code, entitled "Village President's Authority to Declare a State of Emergency," and pursuant to Section 11-1-6 of the Illinois Municipal Code (65 ILCS 5/11-1-6); and

WHEREAS, the Village President has determined that it is necessary to make this Executive Order to best protect the public's health, safety and welfare regarding COVID-19;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDERED, by the Village President of the Village of Lombard, DuPage County, Illinois, as follows:

SECTION 1: Incorporation. That the recitals above shall be and are incorporated in this Section 1 as if restated herein.

SECTION 2: Executive Order. That it is ordered as follows:

1. In the event a liquor licensee ceases to do business at the licensed premises as a result of State of Illinois Executive Order 2020-07 suspending on-premises consumption of food or beverages, such cessation of business shall not serve as the basis for an automatic reduction in the number of authorized liquor licenses in the particular liquor license class relative to said liquor licensee under Section 112.27 of the

Lombard Village Code. Any liquor licensee that desires to close its business or place of business for more than 45 successive days as a result of State of Illinois Executive Order 2020-07 shall not be subject to the automatic liquor license termination for cessation of business, as provided for in Section 112.27 of the Lombard Village Code, and shall not be required to notify the Local Liquor Commissioner in writing, nor be required to obtain a time extension for reopening on a showing of good cause.

SECTION 3: Duration. That this Executive Order shall expire upon the earlier of: (a) the Declaration ending; or (b) withdrawal of this Executive Order by the Village President.
